Dear Students, Parents/Guardians, Staff, and Community,

**Effective at the end of the school day, the Rock Valley Community School District will be closed indefinitely.** Information on an exact re-open date will be communicated as we gain clarity on this fluid situation.

- Students in grades 1-12 will be sent home with their laptop/iPad.
  - Students in grades 1-3 will bring home their iPad they use in class. These devices will have limited internet access. The purpose of this is to allow students to continue to use their math and reading apps to maintain their skills.
  - Students in grade 4-5 will bring home their classroom laptop.
  - Students in grades 6-12 will have assigned work equivalent to 2 days of school per week.
  - Many lower grades will be sending packets of material home students can work on.
  - If your child was absent today you may pick these materials or device up in the office.
- We are working on a possible lunch program for those students who qualify for free or reduced lunches.
- We will not have parent-teacher conferences. Instead, teachers will be communicating with students weekly to check in on them. This will be done by via voice messaging, when possible.
- The building is closed to all, except at the discretion of the superintendent.
- All events and practices are postponed during this time. We will be disinfecting the building so please keep your children out of the building.
- We ask everyone to follow the recommendations and directives from the various government offices we shared last night.

During these unprecedented times, we ask that you stay safe and follow the health recommendations the government has given. Your understanding through these difficult times is greatly appreciated.

I am sure there are many questions, which we may or may not have answers to as new information seems to come daily. If you have questions, please direct them to the superintendent's office.

One day we may say we all overreacted. However, for the safety of children, I would rather say we overreacted than underreacted. Please be safe.
